## 1. SUMMARY

Deliverable D6.1 was to deliver a bilingual public project website, social media accounts and Intranet for EU-China-Safe project.

## 2. INTRODUCTION

The main objective of the website both in EU and China is to inform stakeholders about the project objectives and progress. To implement the deliverable the domain name [www.euchinasafe.eu](http://www.euchinasafe.eu) had been registered.

EU-China-Safe website is bilingual, in English and Chinese language, including identical content at both language versions. Translation into Chinese has been done by UCD.

The private area of the public website has been also created and will be used internally within the consortium in order to share documents and information, ensuring fast and easy communication between all the participants. Intranet site will be operated only in English.

## 3. PUBLIC WEBSITE

The EU-China-Safe website, accessible at <http://www.euchinasafe.eu>, has been created using PSPad editor. All website administration will be carried out via PSPad editor. All used code is compliant with W3C standards; it is entirely built in HTML5, CSS3 and JQuery. The website is hosted on servers at the University of Chemistry and Technology, Prague (VSCHT) and is protected by the university's firewall and virus protection.

Dedicated sections inform all interested stakeholders / potential end-users / wide public on the progress of the project and activities of interest for the industry, scientific community and the general public. **Social networking tools such as LinkedIn / Twitter / ResearchGate** as well as audio-visual content have been also incorporated to further support the interactions and build an active and sustainable network to implement project goals. The use of technologies such as **YouTube** etc. will enhance the efficiency and attractiveness of knowledge sharing activities (e.g. of contents from face-to-face events) and provide for feedback possibilities from general public and groups not directly involved in the project.

Social media accounts have been registered by VSCHT (LinkedIn and Twitter), by FERA (ResearchGate), by CFSA (WeChat for communication among Chinese partners and also among Chinese and EU partners). EU-China-Safe YouTube channel has been also registered at <https://www.youtube.com/channel/UCAA1mqQNGU4DpKhTOgRDVA>. Since in China YouTube is not accessible, another options will be explored, e.g. Youku, in cooperation with CFSA.

The **upper banner** on the website includes project logo, fast link to the project contact email, button for change of website language version English / Chinese, link to Partners area (Intranet) and Search function.

**Below the upper banner**, pictures illustrating key food commodities project deals with are displayed.

Below this banner, frame "**Sign up for stakeholders' database**" invites stakeholders to join the EU-China-Safe stakeholders' database to receive the latest news about the project; a registration form was created for this purpose. Email address [euchinasafe@euchinasafe.eu](mailto:euchinasafe@euchinasafe.eu) and respective folder have been created for collation of registrations and e-mail communication at VSCHT.

Another frames show **logos of the Project partners** and **Highlights** with the information on the latest project news.



The **lower banner** includes **EU flag, acknowledgement and disclaimer, QR code of the project website domain, contact information to the project coordinators, quick links** to the information on the project activities and **Twitter feed**.

**Buttons for active links to social medial accounts** (Twitter, LinkedIn, ResearchGate) are placed on the right part of the website.

The website is structured into several pages as follows:

**HOME** introduces visitors to a brief description on the EU-China-Safe via a description on the project (**ABOUT PROJECT**), Key facts on the project funding and duration, and information on both coordinators in EU and China.

**EU-CHINA-SAFE OVERVIEW** provides brief information on the project and its objectives.

**WORKPLAN** gives information on planned activities of individual work packages.

**PARTNERS** page is divided into two subpages for projects partners coming from the **EU** and **China**, including logos, organisations names and links to their webpages.

**TRAINING** page has two subpages on **TRAINING NETWORK** and **TRAINING MATERIALS**; these pages will be filled by the information on training activities.

**VIRTUAL REFERENCE LAB (RL2020)** page, for which also dedicated logo has been designed, provides brief information on planned activities.

**DISSEMINATION** page with sub-pages **DISSEMINATION MATERIALS, SCIENTIFIC PUBLICATIONS, E-NEWSLETTERS** will inform all interested stakeholders on key project outputs through the flyers, videos, e-newsletters, scientific papers etc.

**EVENTS** page informs on the project meetings.

**PRESS AND MEDIA** provides links to the Press releases, and information on the project in media.

The screenshots of the different pages hosted within the website and social media pages are shown in Appendix I and II.

## 4. INTRANET

The EU-China-Safe Intranet is accessible from the public website [www.euchinasafe.eu](http://www.euchinasafe.eu) (link to Partners area) or directly on <http://intranet.euchinasafe.eu>. Joomla! has been selected as the appropriate programming tool and applied to create an Intranet tool. The server, where Intranet is placed, is operated at the University of Chemistry and Technology, Prague (VSCHT).

A security certificate provided by CESNET (Czech Republic) has been installed in order to prove the identity and ownership of the domain name and to enable confidential communication between the web server and the connected EU-China-Safe users.

To facilitate communication among project partners, different tools and functions are available on the Intranet. Documents related to activities of individual WPs, RL2020 and the whole consortium will be collated, including also the list of participant's contacts, templates for documents and dissemination activities etc. It will also serve as a space for data sharing among project partners.

To assure the confidentiality of information and data, registration process including personal logins and passwords will be needed for each EU-China-Safe participant, confirmed by the Intranet administrator (VSCHT). All registered users will have an access to all parts of the Intranet, with the access rights to upload, download, delete, and edit any file. If needed, access rights can be adapted accordingly.



Intranet web tool has the following structure:

**Home** page Welcomes to the Intranet and provides quick link to Calendar.

The section “**Mailing list**” provides access to the mailing list(s) used inside the consortium. Mailing list(s) will be created in order to easily contact all the people involved in project consortium and to ensure that the email addresses are up to date. Section Contacts will be used to create mailing list(s) by Intranet administrator.

The section “**Contacts**” contains information about each project participant, i.e. contact details including photo, role in the project, gender, etc. This information is only used for the management issues inside the EU-China-Safe project.

The section “**Calendar**” enables adding information on events; events related to the project activities will be announced.

The section “**Frequently asked questions (FAQ)**” provides floor for explanation of different issues related to operation of the Intranet, public website and also project activities.

The section “**User detail**” enables edit a user profile.

The section “**Advisory Board documents**” is dedicated to the documents produced by the EU-China-Safe Advisory Board.

The section “**Project Management Board documents**” is dedicated to the documents produced by the EU-China-Safe Project Management Board.

The section “**WP areas**” is used to inform participants about documents produced in the frame of the EU-China-Safe project by their workpackage group. This work area is divided into individual 6 work package areas as defined in the DoA. Each work package is free to organize the documents in their work area according to their needs. In folder for WP6: Dissemination, exploitation and training, materials for dissemination purposes such as flyers, newsletters etc. are stored.

**ABOUT PROJECT**

EU-China-Safe will involve researchers in Europe and China to develop a cohesive partnership that will deliver a shared vision for food safety and authenticity and work towards "mutual recognition". Comprising 16 participants from the EU and 17 from China, EU-China-Safe contains key research organisations, government and industry needed to develop and jointly implement major advances in improving food safety and containing food fraud in the fast trading blocks.


EU-China-Safe will build the core components needed for a joint EU-China food safety control system comprising: control management; food legislation; food inspection; food control laboratories; and food safety and quality information, education and communication.

The project will develop an EU-China joint Laboratory Network that will achieve and demonstrate equivalency of results, and will develop a state of the art virtual laboratory with interoperable staff from two continents. That will be used as a "connector" to communicate and demonstrate best practice. Innovative traceability tools will strengthen the most vulnerable supply chains. New or improved detection capabilities for chemotoxicological hazards and food fraud will be implemented in a harmonised way across the EU-China network. Trade barriers caused by food safety and fraud issues will be analysed and recommendations of how to predict and prevent future events disseminated.

## OBJECTIVES

**OBJECTIVES**

Over recent years, China has become the EU's biggest source of imports and second most important export market. Bilateral EU-China trade amounted to € 520 billion in 2016, and the aim is for the trade to reach € 700 billion by 2020. In Europe and China, consumer trust in the food industry and regulatory authorities has been damaged by a large number of accidental and deliberate food contamination/adulteration incidents. The ability of European Union (EU) companies to export to, and import from China, has been hampered by these safety, regulatory, and fraud issues. Chinese companies trying to export to Europe face similar obstacles. Twenty-first century food supply chains are increasingly complex and highly vulnerable to safety and fraud threats. Increasing demand and growing markets enhance the likelihood of food safety incidents and deliberate contamination, which in turn can compromise trust and undermine business trade at domestic and international levels. Several incidences of food fraud and contamination have focused attention on product integrity, such as the 2008 Chinese melamine incident, and the 2013 European horsemeat scandal. Furthermore, laboratories in Europe and China are often working to different quality standards and using different analytical methods for producing data for certification/confirmation purposes, which can result in protected trade disruptions/barriers. There is a clear need for greater co-operation among those key actors within the EU and China, who are responsible for ensuring food safety and preventing fraud, to accelerate the achievement of 'mutual recognition' of food standards, testing and verification, similar to that already achieved in other areas between these regions.

**Strategic objective:**

To develop and implement a shared vision of best practice within the EU and China that will enhance food safety, deter food fraud, restore consumer trust, deliver mutual recognition of data and standards and support the flow of agri-food trade between the two trading blocks to promote economic growth.

**Specific objectives:**

- To define a shared framework for harmonisation and equalisation of data that will enable convergence of standards and practices
- To improve transparency in management of the food chain through the development of a digitised DNA system and resolve traceability issues
- To develop, in collaboration, next-generation food authenticity surveillance systems
- To develop, in collaboration, improved food safety systems and practices
- To build confidence in EU-China trade to improve understanding of consumer practices and regulatory frameworks, the latter by developing and demonstrating mutual recognition of laboratory standards and results
- To enhance EU-China co-operation and knowledge exchange through a series of joint initiatives on training and dissemination, in the area of ensuring the integrity of exported and imported food

The focus of these objectives is to bring about improvements in consumer confidence and safety and facilitate sustainable growth in trade between the EU and China.

## WORK PLAN

**WORK PLAN**

A highly structured 48-month work plan has been drawn up by the EU-China-Safe to build preparedness to prevent, deter and manage various types of food risks in the food chain, caused by a contamination incident or fraud, which may have a different impact depending on the type of incident (microbiological or chemical incident, fraud, threats or mislabelling).

5 integrated research and innovation work packages (WPI) have been designed, and 3 overarching data management, project management and ethics requirements work packages.

**WPM1: Data harmonisation and visualisation**

The overall goal of WPM1 is to coordinate the collection, harmonisation, sharing and archiving of data collected and generated by the project, at least on the EU side, and to document data collection methods and procedures. As a support WPI, WPM1 involves WPI2, WPI3 and WPI4 to do their job in an efficient way without duplicating efforts or wasting time on technical issues. To reach this goal, the following objectives have been defined:

- To develop a Data Management Plan aimed at increasing and facilitating data extraction from various sources, and data generation in EU-China-Safe
- To design and maintain an internal database suitable for storing the data generated in the project
- To collect, harmonize when necessary, and collate data needed in WPI2, WPI3 and WPI4, and establish common references for data from different sources and with different granularity, so that datasets can be linked together
- To select and document data collection/storage methods and procedures, and where applicable also data analysis methods
- To connect EU-China-Safe to relevant data repositories where the generated data can be made available after the project end, in particular the H2020 Open Research Data Pilot
